Mildred Keller never needed much in the way of material things many people crave. She's always been content with what she had: a devoted husband, children, and some very close friends. That was enough. Even at this advanced stage in her life this mother of four couldn't be happier.

Mildred was born in Rochester and spent most of her early years living in the city with her parents and six siblings. Her mind and body are still working well although not like they used to. But, hey, what do you expect from someone who turned 104 on April 22.

Until moving into her Legacy five years ago, Mildred had been living alone at her home in East Irondequoit. All Park Crescent's residents love and admire her for her dry wit and alertness. Mildred attended parochial school up until eighth grade. By the time she turned 15 she was working at Kodak. She married the late Frank Keller in 1929 and besides their children now has eight grandchildren and five great grandchildren.

Frank worked for many years with the local office of IBM. Then, in 1949, their lives changed dramatically when they bought a farm in Ontario. Frank worked it until his death 20 years ago.

Although there's been no extraordinary experiences to look back on, Mildred has found her life to be richly rewarding — in its own way simply beautiful as well. ■

You can thank Park Crescent resident Bill Wilson for that. His voluntary service is conducted under the

AARP's Senior Tax Program. Among his other clients, Bill uses the program to help Legacy residents prepare their federal and state income taxes

which are checked by IRS-Approved counselors. Taxes are prepared by computer using the Tax Wise government issued program and filed electronically. This past year 41 Park Crescent residents were served.

Bill has been a Legacy resident for the past two and a half years and has enjoyed 64 years of marriage to his wife, Edith. The couple has four children, seven grandchildren and five great grandchildren. He was an engineering supervisor at Kodak for 39 years. ■
